### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Recreational clubs like LABUE have an obligation to introduce and sustain their sport in our community by supporting programs dedicated to young people. 4 Seasons Ski Club, various tennis clubs, and golf organizations have been involved in such programs for many years. Without active youth programs, participation in these sports would surely decline and even disappear in our communities, as current participants grow older and become less active. Over the past 14 years, it has been a challenge for LABUE to create and sustain an effective Youth SCUBA program. Although our Bylaws provide for a Youth Committee to introduce and promote the sport of scuba diving among young people in our community, our results have been mixed. At various times in the past, we have had youth involved in LABUE and adult members interested in this leading this effort. We have been involved in swimming programs, as well as successfully encouraging young members become certified divers. While all of us recognize the importance of introducing young people to these activities at an early age in order to sustain this sport in our community, we also recognize that it takes LABUE Members who are extremely dedicated and willing to lead this effort on our behalf. In addition, from a practical standpoint, there are liability concerns associated with getting youth involved in scuba certification programs. LABUE Members can encourage young people to get certified; however, unless their parents or other family members are certified divers, what member would be willing to accept responsibility for them as a dive buddy? Furthermore, how many parents are going to trust their child's life with an adult dive buddy that is not a relative or trusted friend during an ocean dive? How can LABUE develop an effective youth program that will generate future divers and avoid the challenges we have faced in the past? I think there are a number of

ways we can accomplish this.

For many years our Discover Scuba Program has introduced both adults and young people to scuba diving. After participants learn about scuba during a brief classroom session, they have the opportunity to try out scuba equipment on a shallow dive under the close supervision of a dive instructor. They experience what it is like to breathe underwater, providing a preview of the underwater world available only thru scuba diving. Discover



Scuba has been the first step and the inspiration for many to pursue dive certification and our continued support of this program could be an important part of our Youth Program.

Our participation in community events such as the Compton Air Fair provides another effective platform to spur interest in scuba diving and inspire young people to pursue the sport in the future. The main focus of this annual event has been to inspire youth within the South Central Los Angeles Area to pursue careers in aviation and other rewarding professions, and to showcase recreational organizations in the Los Angeles area

such as LABUE. LABUE volunteers staffing this event over the last 3 years can attest to the interest and excitement generated in the young people visiting our display.

LABUE's involvement as an advocate of NOAA's Aquarius program is another example of ways that LABUE can inspire youth and

introduce them to scuba diving without assuming the responsibilities of youth dive training programs. This program brings the science of ocean conservation and the underwater world to schoolchildren during live internet broadcasts allowing them to communicate directly with diverscientists living in an underwater sea laboratory. NOAA has specifically targeted African-American and Latino students as recipients of this cutting edge program.

LABUE has the opportunity to pro-

vide a valuable introduction to scuba and inspiration to a new generation of Youth considering options for recreational sports. If it is impractical to develop and maintain actual scuba certification and dive programs for young people, perhaps it is worth-

> while to consider programs designed to introduce, educate, and inspire them to consider scuba as an option when they are older.

LABUE Member Joe Windolph is currently researching additional ways that LABUE can participate in programs to get young people involved in the sport. We are currently ex-

ploring possible LABUE participation in educational programs sponsored by the California African-American History Museum, Natural History Museum, public libraries, the Boy Scouts, and others. #### MEMBER'S CORNER:

Low Country Seafood Boil Recipe BY: RANDY TILLERY



6-8 whole crabs or broken into pieces

1 pound shrimp

1 dozen clams

1 pound andouille or kielbasa sausage

1 dozen crawfish

4 ears corn (halved)

6-8 red potatoes (depending on size, halved )

Old Bay seasoning

Zaterain Crab & Shrimp Boil pouch

Heat a large stock pot of water to a boil. Add 1 pouch of Zaterain's Crab & Shrimp Boil mix to the pot. Add potatoes and corn to boiling water for 20 minutes or until tender. Then, add crabs, crawfish and sausage to pot, return to boil for 5-7 minutes

Add shrimp to pot, return to boil for 5 minutes

Drain water, sprinkle Old Bay seasoning to taste over everything.

#### **BYLAWS REVISION**

Every so often the LABUE Bylaws need to be revised to keep them current and in line with emerging technology. Since the current bylaws have not been revised for several years, the Board has reviewed the bylaws and decided that changes are necessary. To keep the membership informed and involved in the process, the proposed bylaws are attached to this newsletter for review by interested parties. The following is offered as a summary of the major changes being proposed:

#### 2010 LABUE BYLAWS REVISION HIGHLIGHTS

- Article 3C (Sister Clubs) Article added to formalize LABUE's relationship with other dive clubs that will become "Sister Clubs" for the mutual benefit of both clubs.
- Article 4 (Officers) Revised Article to make it easier for members to become eligible for LABUE Board Member positions by relaxing qualification requirements and providing the Board with some discretion in declaring long time LABUE members to be eligible for Board positions. This Article also revises LABUE Officer Descriptions to be more generic; allowing the flexibility to assign specific LABUE operational functions and tasks to LABUE Committees or other qualified members.
- Article 5A (Reprimand/Replacement of Board Members) Revised Article to clarify procedures in place for reprimand or replacement of LA-BUE Board Members.
- Article 6 (Committees) Revised Article to clarify LABUE fundraising and budgeting activities, renamed Fundraising Committee to Ways and Means Committee. Clarify description of Publicity and Internet Committee to include only internet related tasks and activities, renamed to Internet Committee. Expand Technical Dive Committee activities to include adventure and dive specialty activities, renamed Adventure/Specialty/Technical Dive Committee. Expand LABUE Committees to include:
  - Dive Trip Planning Committee
  - Newsletter Committee
  - Program Committee
- Article 9 (Board Meetings) Revised Article to allow, under certain
  circumstances with prior approval, the option of participation in Board
  meetings via telephone conference call, video teleconferencing, or other
  electronic means;. This article also provides that LABUE members may
  request from any LABUE Board Member that an item be considered to be
  included in a Board meeting agenda.
- Article 11 (Voting) Revised Article to allow absentee voting by members in LABUE elections using secure and confidential electronic technologies.
- **Article 13 (Liability Waivers)** Revise Article to require divers participating in multi-day LABUE Dive Vacations to have dive insurance such as that offered by Divers Alert Network or equivalent.
- Article 15 (Policies for Activities) Revise Article to prohibit selling, promoting, or marketing of non-LABUE merchandise, events, or services at LABUE meetings or events without prior approval of the Board.

All members are invited to provide input and otherwise participate in a discussion of these proposed revisions at the November General Meeting. Following this meeting, the Board will consider all the input received and then decide which of the proposed changes to incorporate into the club bylaws.
