

AUSTRALIAN LIVEABOARD OPENS

As previously announced, \$600 deposits are now being accepted for next year's LABUE club trip which will be a 5 day-4 night liveaboard adventure on the Spirit of Freedom to Australia's Coral Sea and Great Barrier Reef region. This luxurious 120' vessel will depart from Lizard Island after a brief flight from Cairns, Australia on October 25, 2007 and return on the 29th. LABUE has chartered the entire boat for 22 lucky divers (potentially 26 depending on the configuration) whom are the first to submit their deposits. The exact cost of the liveaboard is still being negotiated and, upon request, anyone submitting a deposit will receive a full refund once the final prices for the boat are announced. The order in which the deposits are received establishes a priority list for room requests and roommates. The prices for the liveaboard are expected to range from \$1200 - \$1600 plus applicable taxes and local fees. Airfare from LAX is not included, although LABUE will offer flight arrangements for anyone participating. In addition, a 4 day-3 night pre trip to Fiji with diving in the Bega Lagoon is also being arranged as an optional add-on. Finally, for those interested in sightseeing in Australia following the liveaboard, the club will also offer a suggested land package designed to expose participants to some of the many highlights of Australia. Airfare from LAX to Australia, with a stopover in Fiji, is expected to be approximately \$1500. Laying over in Fiji does not add much, if anything, to the cost of the air from LA. The Hotel in Fiji would be extra. This trip will feature the best of the diving in the Coral Sea and the Great Barrier Reef area. It is usually possible to get in as many as 12-16 dives during the 5 day span. Because of the anticipated high demand, members are advised to submit their deposits as soon as possible. Several checks have already been received and more are expected at the December 12th General Membership Meeting..
