

Normally at this time of year, LABUE members have just returned from the annual club trip to an exotic location in the Caribbean. While always a lot of fun, the club trip has also served as a tune-up for the upcoming prime dive season in Southern California. However, because we are traveling to the Philippine Islands this year, the seasons are reversed and our trip is not until late October. Whereas the club trip is usually the beginning of the most active dive period, this year's fall trip occurs near the end of that period. The problem which arises is that some of us do not dive as often as we should and might not realize that, by the time the Philippines arrives, over 18 months will have passed since many of us 'got wet' in Belize. Not a good thing!!! More than ever, it is important to schedule a few dives to maintain your dive readiness and to put yourself in the best possible position to have the dive trip of a lifetime in the Philippines. It would not be fair to your-

self, your dive buddy or to other divers on the trip if you arrived in the Philippines in need of a dive tune up. While we are all willing to help, this trip is too expensive to have to spend time doing remedial dive activities simply because someone was not properly prepared. You don't want to be that person who slows everyone down because your dive skills are a bit rusty. The other potential problem involves making sure that your regulator and BC have been recently serviced and your computer has new batteries. Being fully prepared to dive in the Philippines is not an option...it is a responsibility!!!
