



SPECTACULAR FIJI

Most members of The Los Angeles Black Underwater Explorers returned from the club dive trip to Fiji this past weekend.

Suffice it to say that the trip was a tremendous success!!!

The diving was good and everyone in attendance experienced a totally different underwater environment. For one thing, most club divers are familiar with the approximately 400 species of fish which exist in the Caribbean. In the South Pacific, there are over **1300** species of fish.

For one week, the entire Koro Sun Resort was transformed into a LABUE village. Whether it was hiking the back trails, playing volleyball, golfing, bike riding, enjoying spa treatments or karaoke make believe, the pleasant relationships developed with the Fijian people there was an added bonus. The Fijian people were very friendly and went out of their way to make their guests feel special. By the end of the week, virtually every staff person was calling the club members by their first name.

Another highlight had to be the visit to the nearby Fijian village. LABUE members were greeted by the village Chief and participated in a Kava ceremony. The trip attendees had previously decided to bring school supplies, books and other items of use to the village children. Needless to say, the villagers were overwhelmed by the club's generosity. As a show of their appreciation, about 40 village children came to the Koro Sun Resort on the last night to serenade the club members with several local Fijian songs. It was a very moving evening...far too difficult to describe if you weren't there.

The final touch was the local resort staff serenading LABUE members with the traditional Fijian farewell. Because of the relationships developed, this trip to Fiji will easily be the most memorable of all the club trips. All of the club trips have been fun. But Fiji was special.



President's Message

At the upcoming club elections to be held in November, the four officer positions as well as the three current 'at large' positions are available to eligible candidates. Article 4 of the club Bylaws clearly defines the requirements which must be satisfied in order to qualify as a candidate. These qualifications were developed to help ensure that potential candidates have clearly demonstrated their commitment to the club and its objectives. The requirement that a candidate have been a LABUE member for the two years preceding the election year allows club members to become familiar with the abilities, motives and attitudes of potential candidates, increasing the likelihood that the best candidates will be elected. In addition the Bylaws require that candidates have served on one of the club's standing committees for at least one year. The purpose of this provision is to allow potential candi-

dates an opportunity to demonstrate their work ethic.

Our Board is a working Board. All Board members are expected to contribute a substantial amount of personal time and energy. One of the reasons LABUE has been so successful is because the Board is usually comprised of individuals willing to work and be actively involved in the club's activities. With the new year approaching, now is the time for you to consider joining one of the standing committees, which may lead to your becoming a Board member. Being on the Board is not for everyone. However, for those individuals who want to help LABUE become even better, becoming a Board member is the ultimate opportunity. Your participation is welcomed and encouraged!!!

Cold under water thermoclines were a welcome relief in water that approached seventy-five degrees with visibility of over sixty feet and abundant marine life that included everything but the five hundred pound black sea bass that managed to elude us on this trip. The Great Escape dive boat was filled to capacity as we visited Ship Rock, Bird Rock and Emerald Cove for three great dives that satisfied everyone. The Ad-Spec-Tect members were able to enjoy their specialty dives and still be on the same boat with everyone else including those who chose to hover in sixty foot depths. Several divers were turned away on the days leading up to the sold-out trip thanks to the below-market, subsidized price tag LABUE is able to offer it's members. Club membership continues to have its rewards as long as we continue to support ourselves by coming out and participating in club sponsored events. Club Trip for 2005

As announced previously, LABUE will return to the warm and inviting waters of the British Virgin Islands for the 2005 club dive trip. The club will lodge at the Prospect Reef Hotel for 8 days and 7 nights from April 21—28th. The Prospect Reef Hotel has a dive operation on site and maintains excellent diver support facilities.


The package includes 5 days of two tank dives, with the opportunity to purchase additional dives as desired. The waters of the BVI's are known for their warmth, clarity and excellent variety of tropical fish, coral reefs and shipwrecks. In fact, the wreck of the RMS Rhone located near the hotel is considered the premier wreck in the Caribbean. The Rhone sank in a hurricane over 135 years ago and was split into sections. The enormity of the wreck requires at least two dives for the most enjoyable experience. The diving of the RMS Rhone is included in the package.

This trip will be the 9th annual club dive trip. Each one has been fantastic both from a dive point of view and from a camaraderie point of view. If you missed Fiji, this is another opportunity to join in the fun. The diver package price including air from Los Angeles is \$1625 and the non-diver price is \$1250.

In addition, and only available to those who attend the club trip, there will be limited space available on a one week bare boat sailing and diving trip throughout many of the lesser known BVI islands. Please contact Donna for additional information and to sign up for the club trip, and if interested, the sailing extension.
