## GRAND CAYMANS-2006

The final details have been finalized and, as announced previously, LABUE will hold its 10th annual club trip in Grand Cayman Island from April 20-28, 2006. The trip is now officially open and cash deposits of \$400 are being accepted to reserve a spot. The price begins at \$— and will depend on the options selected.

LABUE will spend 8 days and 7 nights on Grand Cayman Island, the largest of the three islands comprising the Cayman Island chain. The club will be housed at the Sunset House Hotel, the only resort in the Cayman Islands designed by divers, operated by divers, for divers. It is also the only hotel in the Cayman Islands which has its own coral reef with modern and ancient shipwrecks in shallow water right off shore. The package includes roundtrip airfare from Los Angeles, 7 nights accommodations (double occupancy), 5 days of 2-tank dives, unlimited shore diving, daily breakfasts and transfers.

The Cayman Islands are consistently rated among the top 10 dive destinations in the world, where underwater visibility is regularly in the 75-150ft range and can reach over 200ft. These islands have a huge variety of sea life and corals as well as some of the best wall diving in the world. Water temperature is reliably in the low 80's. With the availability of unlimited shore diving right on the premises, some divers will easily complete 20 dives or more during the 6 potential dive days.

The terms of the trip are included in the attached flyer. Anyone interested must submit a signed application along with a \$400 check. As with LABUE's previous trips, \$250 of the deposit is non refundable. Different from previous trips, there will be a limited number of spaces sold and the group size will not exceed 30 divers. Once a suitable number is reached, the trip will close. If you are interested in joining in on what will be an exciting week, it is advisable to act immediately and submit the application today!!!



### President's Message

Well, next year's club trip to the Cayman Islands is finally open. All the prices have been confirmed and for as little as \$1850, club members will be able to enjoy 8 days of memorable diving in one of the best locations in the world.

Fortunate enough to having been to these islands several times, I know first hand how good the diving can be. The thrilling sensation of diving along endless vertical walls which descend to seemingly bottomless blue holes is breathtaking. Books on the Caymans partially try to describe what is really impossible to describe. Spectacular sums it up!

People on club trips have come to expect several things. But one expectation which LABUE cannot satisfy is the desire by some to have a more experienced dive buddy assigned to them because they don't have enough dive experience to feel comfortable. In the past, some relatively inexpe-

rienced divers have gone on club trips anticipating that the club would 'take of them' in terms of providing a more experienced buddy. While LABUE does have individuals who frequently offer to dive with new divers and help them reach a level of independence, most of them are not willing, and rightfully so, to give up some of their dive enjoyment on an expensive dive trip for this purpose. All divers need to be the same type of buddy they would like to pair up with. Ideally, all divers should feel comfortable diving with someone with skills similar to theirs. If they don't, improvements must be made...prior to going to the Caymans.
